

Charles L. Grove (1860-1953)

Charles L. Grove, native of near Wolfsville and for ten years a school teacher in Frederick County before pursuing that profession in Washington County, died at 9:45 o'clock Sunday night at a nursing home in Williamsport. He had resided at 818 Woodland Way, Hagerstown. He had been ill about 19 months and would have observed his 93rd birthday next week. He was a son of the late James A. and Harriet Hayes Grove and started teaching at a school near Braddock when 18 years of age. He moved to the Zittlestown School in Washington County ten years later and taught in public schools in that county until his retirement in 1926. He was a charter member of the old Catoctin Cornet Band of Wolfsville, a member of the Boonsboro Lutheran church and of Logan Tribe, J. O. R. M. Surviving are a daughter, Mrs. Raymond Shifler, Locust Grove, Washington County; three sons, Paul C., Cedar Lane, near Hagerstown; Mark D. and J. Richard, Hagerstown; nine grandchildren and twelve great grandchildren. Friends may call at the funeral home in Boonsboro until time of funeral service at 2 o'clock Wednesday afternoon with Rev. 




Charles L. Grove (1860 - 1953) Son of James and Harriet




Charles L. Grove and Emma Biser Grove (1862 - 1932)

Denton C. Grove, of Dunsmuir, Cal., died at Yreka hospital, Yreka, Cal., on September 5th, aged 78 years. he was a son of the late James A. and Harriet (Hays) Grove, of Wolfsville, and is survived by a sister and brother, Ida M. Ludy and Charles L. Grove, of near Boonsboro. The funeral services were held in Mount Shasta, Cal., with the Dunmuir and Mount Shasta Fraternal Order of Eagles officiating. The remains were sent to Sacramento for cremation, following which the ashes, according to the wishes of the deceased, were scattered in the vicinity of his Dunsmuir home.


Denton Chester Grove (1865 - 1943) Youngest Son of James and Harriet





MRS. IDA M. LUDY, wife of Cyrus M. Ludy, Sherman Avenue, died Saturday afternoon at 2:30 in the Washington County Hospital, after an illness of three weeks, aged 77. Born and reared in Wolfsville, she was the daughter if James A. and Harriet (Hays) Grove, and had resided here for the last forty years. She was a member of St. Paul's Evangelical Church of Funkstown. Surviving are daughters, Mrs. Harriet S. Young, Williamsport, Mrs. Ida Mae Clark, Myersville; sons, Grove Ludy, Waynesburg, Ohio, Lloyd C. Ludy, Myersville, James L. Ludy, Hagerstown; brother, Charles Grove, Rohrersville; 23 grandchildren; and four great-grandchildren.

The body was removed to the funeral home of A. K. Coffman, where services will be held Tuesday afternoon at 2 o'clock, the Rev. Raymond Miller and Rev. Clay E. Rice [son of her sister Anna Melissa] officiating. Interment in the United Brethren cemetery, Myersville.

The Family of Mollie (Grove) Powell and William Powell (Washington County)

William and Mollie (Grove) Powell established a large family of Powells in Washington County, Maryland. There were thirteen children (ten surviving childhood). They also raised their grandson, George L. Davis after the death of his father Alvey Davis of tuberculosis in 1914.

In one copy of the preceding photo of a gathering at the Powell farm, the gentleman looking upward (upper right hand corner) is identified as Charles Powell, brother of William. This has created a problem in identification. William had three brothers: John E., Jerome and Andrew. Is he one of them but misnamed by someone as Charles? Another copy of the picture has this man identified as Alvey Davis, the first husband of Iva Powell. He, however, died in 1914 and Iva married a second time to Frank May and one of their twin daughters, Geraldine (born 1916), is in this photograph. Could this gentleman be Harry Powell (1892-1974) one of the sons of William and Mollie? Harry's wife Lottie and first two sons, "Whitie" and "AJ", are in this picture. They lived at the time in St. James not far from the Powell farm. He though would have been in his early twenties. The man pictured appears much older? Was Harry the family member chosen to take the picture? The young woman behind Geraldine May is identified as Annice (Powell) Stelzer (1920-2005). She was one of the daughters of Russell Powell and Clara (Mowen) Powell (1896-1926), granddaughter of William and Mollie. Annice would have been a baby at the time of this photograph. Also, to whom belonged the wonderful 1920's automobile in the background? Perhaps someone someday will be able to answer these questions. There are always questions when looking at old photographs.
